

Happy Tails

Stories of recent happy adopted endings

Star came to Bond County Humane Society with her mom Raven, her sister Puff and her brother Smokey. Star and her siblings were very sick. They were skin and bones with a lot of hair. Smokey didn't make it. Star then got sick with E. coli. We almost lost her twice, but were able to nurse her back to health. Star's immune system was weakened so she developed Feline Herpes. Feline Herpes is a chronic condition that she will have all her life. Star was adopted in 2010 and returned in 2011 because the man who adopted her couldn't take a cat where he



was moving. Star was adopted again in January 2012 into her forever home by a BCHS volunteer – KayAnna, our Vice President of Feline Wellness. "I had fallen in love with her the day I saw her 5 years ago," KayAnna writes. "Star is a mischievous, fun and lovable cat. Her sister Puff, who was adopted and returned, and Raven their mother are both available today for adoption at BCHS. They all look alike: beautiful, long haired black cats." KayAnna entered Star in BCHS's 2013 Calendar Cover Photo contest and Star did very well in the competition. You can find her gazing out at you all February.



Floyd's Story

" 'What is that sound?' were the words I first said when I heard a sound similar to a baby crying when I began as a BCHS volunteer at the Cat Shelter in mid 2011. 'Oh, that's Floyd,' was the response. **Floyd** turned out to be a short haired black cat. (I was afraid of cats until I was introduced to my fiancé's male cat, Cookie. Thus began a new knowledge of cats with their attitude, and carefree spirit. Years later, Cookie became sick and I held his weak body once before he passed away. I had found a new caring feeling about cats).

Therefore every week I would visit Floyd at the shelter and hold him. Floyd would hiss at me after I put him back in his cage to which I would respond with, 'WHAT?' Over time my love for him grew although he had hair loss from nervously chewing on himself and gingivitis which made him an unlikely cat for adoption. His history showed he had been adopted as a kitten by a military person but brought back because of military orders.

I took Floyd home one weekend to become a Foster Parent but my fiancé knew before I did that Floyd would never leave. I adopted Floyd a couple weeks later and know he is finally home.

PETCO FOUNDATION Approves New Vehicle Grant for BCHS Story by Dennis Hundsdorfer

Last May 2012 Bond County Humane Society submitted a grant request to the PETCO Foundation for a new transport vehicle. The new vehicle was needed to safely and efficiently expand and meet increasing transportation needs into the future. The van would be used to: transport free roaming/feral cats to and from a specialized spay/neuter clinic 75 miles away; transport BCHS shelter animals to and from adoption partner locations to participate in adoption events; transport rescued animals locally for spay/neuter surgery and/or other medical treatment; transport injured or rescued animals protected under wildlife laws to appropriately licensed clinics for treatment and rehabilitation; provide transportation assistance during disaster (tornadoes, floods, fires, etc) recovery rescue operations; assist with shelter-to-shelter animal relocation transports; and transport equipment and supplies to and from numerous community programs, fundraising activities and BCHS facility projects and maintenance.

To be considered for this grant BCHS had to have demonstrated its support of PETCO Foundation's mission statement. This statement reads "*Raise the quality of life for pets and people who love and need them*" The four requirements to fulfill their mission are to create responsible pet owners, reduce the number of animals euthanized, rescue animals in crisis, and rehabilitate behavioral issues in pets. On August 3rd BCHS received notification from Mr. Paul Jolly, Executive Director, PETCO Foundation, that the request had been approved. The grant funding provided for the purchase of a new 2013 van and a portion of the related operational expenses for the first year.

Steve Schmitt Auto Group of Highland, IL was the successful bidder. BCHS placed an order for the new Chevrolet Van the end of August and took delivery November 9th. The photo shows Rachel and Dennis Hundsdorfer accepting the cargo van on behalf of BCHS from Adam Hanebrink of Schmitt's in Highland. The van has been placed in service to begin helping the animals.

Buchheit Fundraisers Help Feed BCHS Animals Story by D. Hundsdorfer and R. Clausen



Matt Seabaugh, Manager of the Buchheit Greenville store, recently held two more month long fundraisers to benefit the shelter animals at Bond County Humane Society. When checking out at the store, Buchheit customers were asked to make donations to their fundraiser called "Pounds for Paws" which would help feed BCHS shelter animals. On July 13, 2012, BCHS accepted a Buchheit gift card for \$80. On hand for that presentation were Dennis Hundsdorfer and Sheila, an adoptable Golden Retriever mix who spent her goodwill visit making friends with store associates and customers.

The latest project was an even larger success with donations exceeding \$700 by the end of the month. The drastic increase in the donation is a result of Seabaugh pitting his registers against each other in a fundraising contest. On September 29, 2012, Buchheit staff presented BCHS with a Buchheit gift card valued at \$775 to be used to purchase food for the shelter animals. This presentation coincided with BCHS's first "5th Saturday" Adoption Day Event held at Buchheit.

This money will go a long way toward maintaining our food supply at both shelter locations in Greenville. Our sincere thanks to Matt Seabaugh and his staff for helping us care for the shelter animals and to the Buchheit customers for caring enough to make the donations.

Shelter News Update

We've been hard at work creating a welcoming and lived-in atmosphere around our new shelter campus site on South Elm Street in Greenville. Landscaping continued in the form of tree-planting in late April 2012. The white pine, blue spruce and Norwegian fir trees were donated by Randy's Country Barn Christmas Trees. Mark File and Dennis Hundsdorfer installed two sign posts and a sign frame in early May. The cedar posts were donated by Christina and Clayton Staff. Temporary BCHS signage is up while we await affordable quotes and/or a donation for a permanent larger sign. The ground in front of the BCHS storage building and dog shelter was graded and seeded with grass the weekend of May 19 and volunteers planted bushes that were donated by Darla Womble, owner of Just Cuts. What's next? When we can afford it, the play yard for our dogs and puppies still needs graded, seeded, rocked and penned in by strong chain-link fencing.

Frozen Custard In The Deep Freeze

October 6, 2012 was Greenville's Apple Day on the courthouse lawn. Countryside Pet Clinic, one of two veterinary facilities in Greenville, cooperated with Bond County Humane Society to have a vendor booth there. Countryside promoted their new heartworm preventative injection, Proheart, and sold cups of Annie's Frozen Custard with all proceeds donated to BCHS. Did we mention that Apple Day temperatures never rose above 50 °F? When the cold day was over and the remaining supply of custard was graciously bought out by a friend of Countryside, the donation total came to just over \$200. The booth was managed by staff from Countryside's Greenville and Vandalia locations and representatives from BCHS. Thank you to Countryside's Debbie Covalesky (and her crew!) and BCHS's Christina Staff for organizing this fundraiser together. No one can predict October temperatures a month in advance, but we can count on pet lovers stopping by to share their family pet stories and to support our organization!



Head Start Kids Meet BCHS Animals Story by D. Hundsdorfer

Bond County Humane Society was invited to bring some of its shelter animals to the Greenville First Baptist Church Head Start Program on October 10, 2012 for a "meet and greet" with the young students. Children ranging in ages from 3 to 5 years old were given the opportunity to get up close and personal with the animals. Rachel Hundsdorfer of BCHS did the introductions and conducted the session. Ritz the kitten and two puppies, Nonnie and Lizzie, did a great job getting to know the children. The program was a huge success and everyone had a good time.

Pickup Truck Donation Story by D. Hundsdorfer

Support and donations to help us care for the shelter animals come in all shapes and sizes. In August 2012 Bond County Humane Society received a donated 1989 Ford Ranger pickup truck from members Joe and Caryl Culumber who retired and moved out of state. This little truck had low miles and was in good mechanical condition. The owners of Blind Quest in Troy, IL (also BCHS members) donated some minor repairs, had the truck detailed inside and out, and displayed it for sale at their place of business in Troy. It sold for \$1,500 in less than a week. This money was desperately needed and is already in use to help cover general operating expenses such as vet bills, medical expenses, etc. A big thank you to Joe and Caryl, and Deb and Lindell Hilling of Blind Quest. We could not continue our work helping the animals without this kind of support.

BCHS Low Cost Spay/Neuter Programs

In 2012, no less than 33 companion cats, 34 companion dogs, and 130 feral/free roaming cats were spayed or neutered through all of the various low-cost programs offered by BCHS. Loud and thunderous thank yous to Rachel Hundsdorfer for her annual effort toward expertly coordinating another incredibly elaborate but incredibly successful 9th Paws In The Park on September 15, 2012. And Rachel had help: Julie, Dennis, Christina, Renea and countless others. This year's event was dedicated to the memory of Laura Plunkett – dearly missed friend, BCHS Volunteer, Member and Treasurer who lost her battle with cancer in August 2012.

Our headcount at 11:30am was 370 people at the park. Wag-N-Walk trail winners Dan & Mignon Fetterhoff raised \$1675 in donation pledges. This was the 3rd year in a row they've won first place and graciously donated back the prize - this year an Amazon Kindle Fire which was subsequently raffled off alongside our many raffle items such as a Char-Broil Grill, hair & beauty salon gift certificates, a wine basket from Copper Dock Winery, and St Louis Cardinals game tickets. Morning attendees enjoyed the Police K-9 Demonstration by Bond County Sheriff's Deputy Dave Dunn and K-9 Officer Bady. Assisting both was Pocahontas Police Officer Gino Feazel. Available, Adorable, Adoptable!

Please help us find homes for these wonderful animals. **Adoptions** are conducted at the BCHS office at 1403 S. Fourth Street in Greenville, at the Petco in Fairview Heights on the 1st and 3rd Saturdays, at the PetSmart in Glen Carbon on the 2nd, 4th Saturdays, and at Buchheit in Greenville on 5th Saturdays. You can visit our website for more information and see more adoptable pets, plus grab a pet adoption application form – www.bondcohs.petfinder.com. Also our **Sponsor-A-Pet** program is underway. You can choose an adult dog or cat living in BCHS care and sponsor them with a donation each month. When your sponsor animal gets adopted, you can opt out OR choose another animal to sponsor. Standard adoption fees range from \$60 (for adult cats) up to \$200 (for purebred dogs) and the fee includes veterinary testing and treatment, routine shots, alteration and state-mandated microchipping.

Purina Pets For Seniors

Bond County Humane Society offers special adoption discounts for seniors, made available through the Purina Pets For Seniors program. Qualifying adopters 55 years of age or older may adopt an eligible cat or dog from BCHS and receive a full adoption fee discount. Some restrictions do apply and a limited number of applications are available each year.

Ryan and Reed are large, long haired, Black Russian Terrier mix dogs about 10 months old in February 2013. "We were surrendered to BCHS along with 3 other dogs when the elderly lady who cared for us moved into a nursing home. Even though we are playful we calm down quickly when play stops and we relax. We are not very rough guys so we would probably do okay around young children. We have not been around cats. We seem to be housetrained, but we are okay with being crated if needed." Ryan is very friendly and has some basic manners because he does know 'Sit' if you have treats for him. Reed is a little shy at first but warms up quickly.
