Rehome by Adopt a Pet

Bond County Humane Society is limited by space, volunteer workers, and fosters for taking in animals. When we are at capacity, that's when Rehome by Adopt a Pet can help—reaching out to hundreds of potential adopters! You post your pet online yourself for adoption at Rehome by Adopt a Pet. If you click through our referral link, your adoptable pet will even show up on our website's Community Pets page. https://link.bondcohumane.org/rehome

Owners add their pet's information and photos to Rehome and pay a small one-time-per-pet listing fee to list their pet. Enter this coupon code to reduce your listing fee by 90%: RCXHAQTL2U8AD8Z.

Adopt a Pet continues to guide the owner through reviewing applications, meeting potential adopters safely, and finalizing the adoption.

VOLUNTEERING can mean shifts of shelter care, animal feeding, kitten socializing, dog walking, office work, fostering, etc. OR assistance at adoption events. We have these opportunities and more for responsible and dependable adults, families, teens, and retirees with a wide variety of interests and abilities. Membership Meetings, Volunteer Opportunities, & Spay/Neuter

In order for BCHS to fulfill its mission it takes a lot of effort on the part of many people!

Membership Meetings are no longer held regularly but scheduled by the board as needed. Society memberships are renewed in the first part of every calendar year. See form on back page!

Low Cost Spay/Neuter Programs Over the last 22 years we've made pet population reduction a major part of our mission. Our spay/neuter coordination in 2025 YTD has helped alter 110 animals in Bond County and close surrounding areas, preventing the unwanted litters.

Snip, Snip Hooray! Cat Spay/Neuter is Back! During 2023, APL ended their spay/neuter clinics for shelter partners; then we depleted our vouchers grant from SNIP Alliance. But, thanks to Hartz Second Chance in Collinsville, we are again offering a low-cost spay/neuter transport option for feral, free roaming, and companion CATS. FCI Employees Club Donates Contest Proceeds to Help Kittens and Pups



Thank you to Federal Correctional Institution (FCI) Greenville Employees Club for holding their Cutest Pet Contest as a fundraiser! Members of the club stopped by the shelter on April 17th to hand-deliver their donation to us. We immediately applied it towards vet bills because... you guessed it... kitten season! So much spaying, neutering, and vaccinating to do! Thanks again to the employees of our neighbor off State Highway 40!

Did you know? FCI's minimum security satellite camp Inmate Program periodically provides BCHS with several shelter workers for kennel assistance and pet socialization! Some of the program's graduating women have even adopted pets from us after their release and once they've secured steady employment!

Enhancing Feline Lives with New Catio

Foster home volunteer Gabriel Gigliotti has donated a new enrichment opportunity for adoptable shelter cats: a Catio! This screened play area has been installed outside the window in Community Room 1. The adult cats now have a closer view of the outdoors, allowing them to watch wild songbirds flutter by and spot puppies playing in the yard. Gigliotti, along with Dennis Hundsdorfer, the Vice President of Facilities at BCHS, made modifications to the purchased structure so that it connects to the shelter windows.

Foster Spotlight: Meet Bret Koca

Hi, My name is Bret Koca. I call Braceville, Illinois home, but my wife Adele and our family have been in Alhambra, about two years now; close enough to foster for the shelter in Greenville. We were looking for a place to help out with adoptable pets and a check on the internet easily led us to you, BCHS!

So, I am a feline foster parent. I do my best to socialize, care for, and have fun with cats and kittens that need an "in between" home—in between rescue and forever.

I've had many roommates (pets) over the years; mostly cats but some dogs, as well. We currently raise chickens, and have in the past raised quail, ducks, turkeys. We're looking forward to the next type of farm animal: poultry or not!

When I'm not tending to my foster cats, you might find me doing forestry stewardship, carpentry, gardening, and definitely spending time with my children.

We have a veterinarian uncle who would donate his time to help heal critters that didn't have much of a chance. But my inspirations that really got me going with animal welfare and fostering are my wife Adele and our late cat, Possum. Adele opened my eyes to the needs of those without homes, and Possum taught me how to respect cats.

Working with BCHS, I've learned that there are people who continue to have a passion to help... even after SO MANY long years! I'm grateful to all of the BCHS team members for what they do on a day-to-day basis. It's not for the money. It's for love.

Here's my advice: It can be hard watching your

foster go to a new adoptive home, but your work helps get them there! It allows for more homeless animals to have a chance at a good life!



If you see me out in your neighbors' yard at night setting traps full of sardines, or in the early morning hours with my flashlight seeing how many cats I was able to catch, please do not call the police. Please also pretend like you don't hear my screams when I find a possum, skunk, or raccoon instead and have to try to get it out of the trap. Spoiler alert: They don't usually want to leave until you leave. These are the confessions of a Community Cat Coordinator.

Earlier this year, Bond County Humane Society announced we had been awarded two grants for our Save the Cats of Bond County Trap-Neuter-Vaccinate-Return program: a Rachael Ray No-Kill Excellence Grant from Best Friends Animal Society AND a City of Greenville, Illinois grant. So we wanted to provide an update.

BCHS collaborates closely with Jim Hess of Bond County Animal Control for each TNVR case. Cat caregivers contact Animal Control, and Officer Hess decides whether to involve BCHS's Community Cat Coordinator. As someone who's passionate about this work, I'm always ready to answer that call!

So far in 2025, we've spayed or neutered 39 cats across 8 communities in Bond County, with more planned. We've provided sturdy, insulated shelters, food, and medicine as needed. Our shelter and foster homes have taken in litters of adoptable kittens, helping to curb the growing number of outdoor cats. When the local resources cannot take any more cats/kittens, Officer Hess then reaches out to other no-kill shelters in the metro-east area to save them from euthanasia.

For those with pets, vet bills can add up quickly. Imagine caring for 10 strays—it's overwhelming. The TNVR program helps break the cycle of overpopulation by trapping, sterilizing, and returning



cats to their colony, even preventing newcomers from invading.

My journey as a "crazy cat lady" began when a momma cat had



kittens in my backyard. I fostered those kittens with BCHS's help, ultimately adopting two myself: foster failure! But, it inspired me to join the TNVR program, I wanted to assist others in similar situations. An older community caregiver on a fixed income couldn't afford to spay/neuter the 7 cats she cared for. We discovered that one of those cats was hiding 6 nursing kittens, leading me to foster them in an emergency. Results may vary with every community cat coordinator.

While the job isn't always glamorous—often you leave smelling like cat pee—it's incredibly rewarding. We hope to secure more grants next year and help more communities on our waitlist. If you're interested in becoming a coordinator, fostering, or volunteering, contact BCHS or me, Jen B, for more information!
